

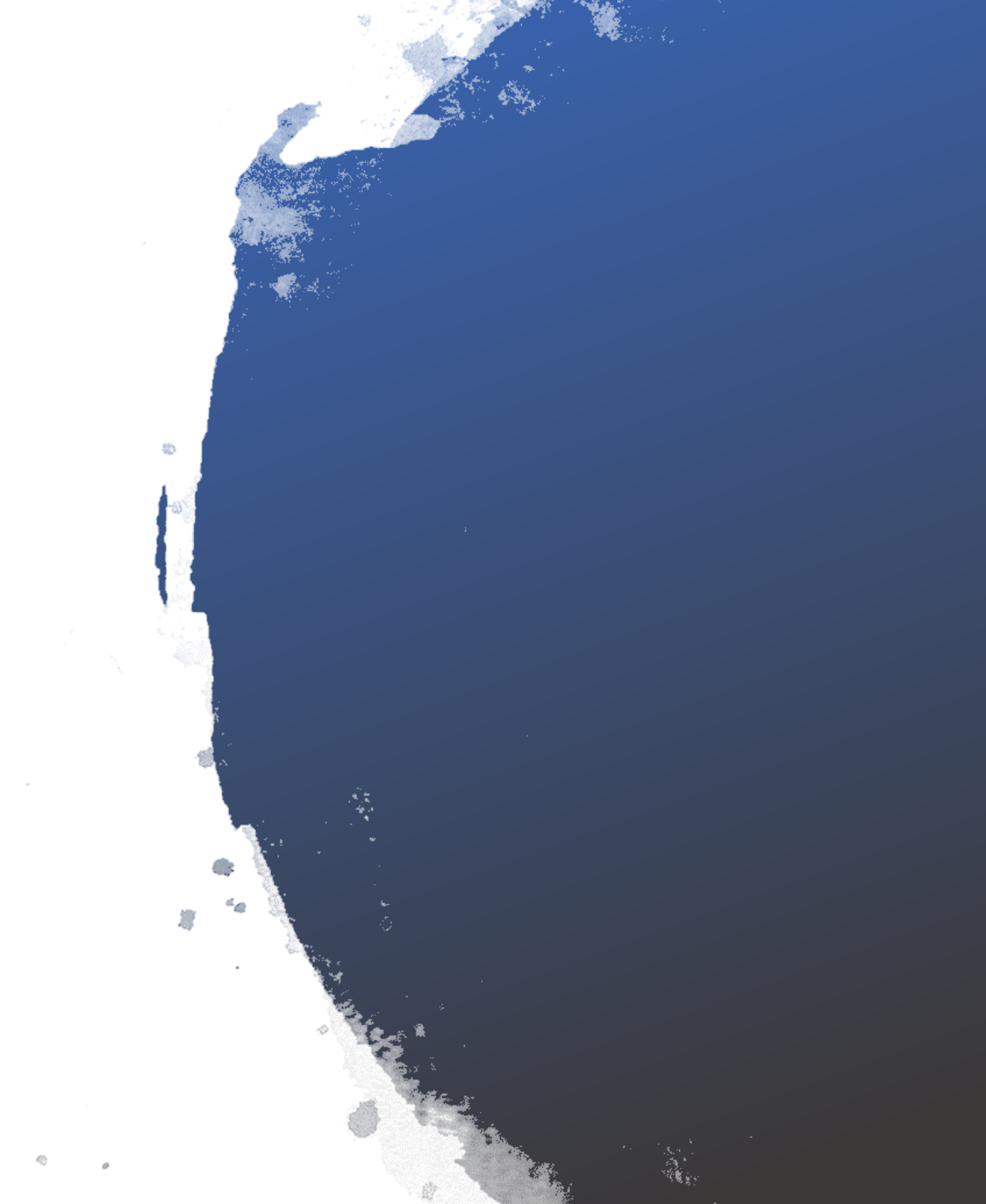

# Hierarchy of laws in India

- Constitution of India;
- Statutory Laws - made either by Parliament or by the State Legislatures; proposed legislation is referred to as a *Bill* and once passed it becomes an *Act*
- Delegated Legislation - laws which are not made by legislatures, but by authorities to whom that power has been specifically granted through a statutory law. These may be in the form of *Rules, Regulations* or *Notifications* made under a statute.
- Executive instructions or Administrative Orders, viz. Government Orders, etc. (which are not delegated legislation, i.e. not expressly made or authorized by a statute)

In the event of a conflict between laws on different levels, the higher level of law prevails.

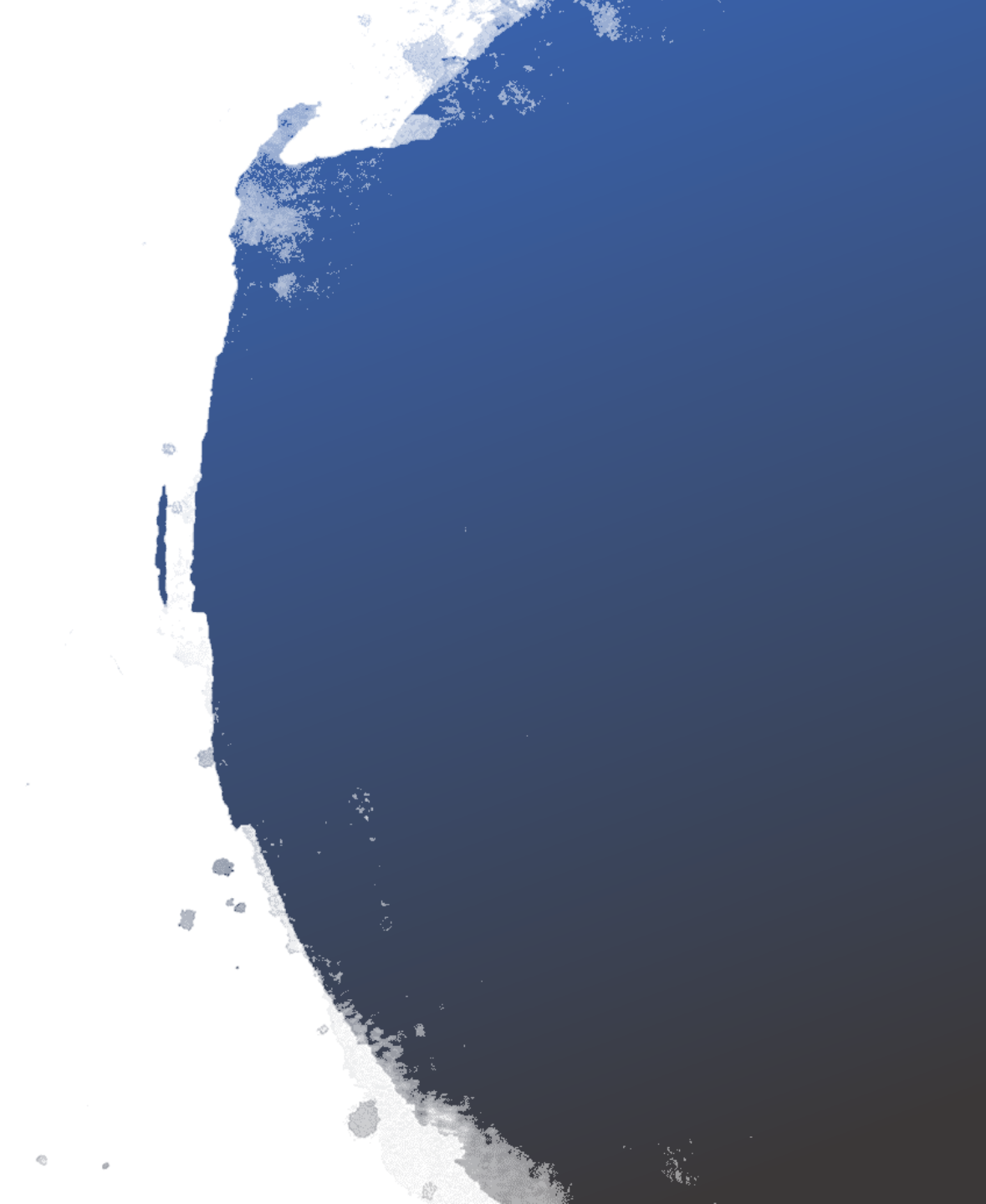

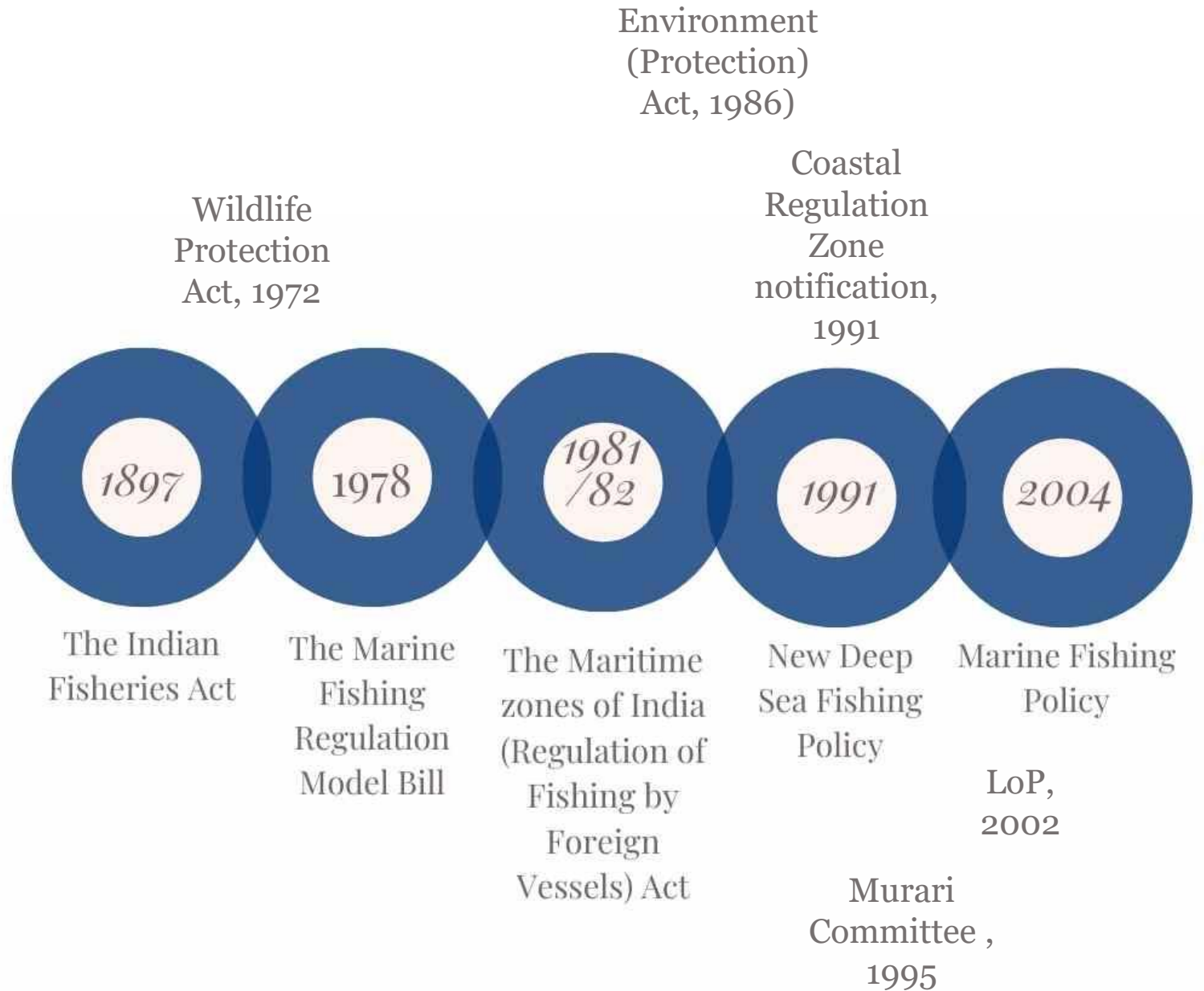
